

**MINUTES of REGULAR MEETING
of the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS
of the CITY of BOWLING GREEN, KENTUCKY
held AUGUST 20, 2019**

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on August 20, 2019. Mayor Bruce Wilkerson called the meeting to order. An invocation was given by Commissioner Brian "Slim" Nash and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. City Clerk Ashley Jackson called the roll, and the following members were present: Commissioner Sue Parrigin, Commissioner Dana Beasley-Brown, Commissioner Joe W. Denning, Commissioner Brian "Slim" Nash and Mayor Bruce Wilkerson. Absent: none. There was a full quorum of the Board of Commissioners.

AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS

Parks and Recreation Director Brent Belcher recognized the Boys Junior Golf Championship winner Collier Curd from Bowling Green High School.

PUBLIC HEARING

Assistant City Manager/Chief Financial Officer Katie Schaller-Ward conducted a public hearing for the purpose of obtaining comments from residents regarding the proposed 2019 property tax rates. She reported total real estate property growth was 5.2%, with existing property growing by 1.9% and new property growth at 3.3%. Ms. Schaller-Ward explained it is required to hold a public hearing when the rate is set between the compensating rate and a rate with a 4% increase. She recommended the 2019 property tax rate remain the same as 2018 at \$0.205 per \$100 of assessed value. There was some history of the new, existing and total growth rates of real property values provided, as well as some comparisons of the average Kentucky tax rates. It was reported the tax budget makes up about 22.7% of the General Fund revenue and 16% of All Funds revenue, which is the City's second largest revenue source. Ms. Schaller-Ward also said property tax bills are expected to be mailed out in early October and payment would be due December 31, 2019 with a 10% penalty to be applied on January 1, 2020. Commissioner Parrigin reiterated property tax is calculated based on the assessment value of real estate which was set by the Warren County Property Valuation Administrator. City Manager Jeffery B. Meisel reemphasized the importance of paying property taxes on time.

Since this was a public hearing, Mayor Wilkerson inquired if anyone from the public wished to speak on the issue. With no comments, the public hearing was closed.

CITY MANAGER

City Manager Jeffery B. Meisel requested a closed session for the purpose of discussion which might lead to the discipline or dismissal of an individual employee without restricting that employee's right to a public hearing if requested. This exception shall not be interpreted to permit discussion of general personnel matters in secret. Motion was made by Parrigin and seconded by Nash to convene in closed session following the regular meeting pursuant to KRS 61.810 (1) (f). Mayor Wilkerson called for roll call vote.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Following the regular agenda, Mayor Wilkerson opened the floor for any public comments about items not included on the agenda. Alberta Smith addressed the Commissioners about an issue she is continuing to have with her neighbor's tree on Nellums Avenue and requested assistance from the City. City Attorney Gene Harmon explained the City's Code of Ordinances does not include language about healthy trees overhanging onto someone else's property and confirmed this is a property owner dispute. Neighborhood and Community Services Director Brent Childers confirmed

Code Enforcement staff has been to the property more than once and there are no code violations. The Mayor agreed to meet with the property owner Leon Tarter and Ms. Smith later in the week.
