


Figure 3- Operations Hours (July - January)










Figure 5- A private business donated pizza to thank our Operations Crews (19 Jan)


- Public Open House: Highland Way & Emmett Ave- City Engineer Melissa Cansler and Assistant City Engineer Kyle Hunt lead an Open House on 23 January to gather public
  - feedback related to proposed road improvements to Highland Way and Emmett Avenue. In preparation for the meeting, post cards were sent to 184 residents and 2 message boards were placed on Highland Way (17-23 Jan).
- Bluegrass Farms Update At the recent design update meeting, the owner's representatives were agreeable with the final design. Pending some minor revisions, the project will be ready to bid in March.
- **Greenhill Street Extension –** The roadway design was completed in December and impacted property descriptions have been submitted for review. Property discussions will begin in February. The signal warrant study for the proposed intersection at Veterans Memorial Blvd. is being reviewed by Kentucky Transportation Cabinet staff in Frankfort. It is anticipated that a signal will be approved at this location.

# Environmental Compliance Update

- Following the removal of the Greencastle Lock & Dam by the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), the water levels in the Barren River below River St. are no longer sufficient to operate a traditional outboard motor with a prop. In response, our division purchased a jet-driven workboat last year. This January's ambient sample collection trip was the first with this equipment. The boat exceeded expectations and restored full access to this section of the river. Samples are collected from a series of 10 surface and ground water sources quarterly; this work is in addition to the <u>underbgky.org</u> real time monitoring network.
- The full analytical report is over 41 pages long; the chart below is a summary of the data collected during October of 2023. These numbers indicate the number of escherichia coli bacteria in each 100 mL of water. E. coli bacteria typically come from the lower intestines of warm blooded animals. While regulations vary around the country, levels above 200 Most Probable Number (MPN)/100mL typically necessitate posting warning signs, such as for swimmers. Often swimming areas are closed when the count rises above 1,000 MPN/100mL. Our karst landscape contributes to our high numbers, as septic systems function poorly here and surface runoff from agricultural areas is directed to sinkholes that emanate in surface streams.




Figure 8- October 2023 Water Sampling Data








Figure 12- (Left) Facilities Maintenance Technician Caleb Houtchen plows at BGPD. (Right) Facilities Manager Dave Hehner clears snow at Public Works Admin (15 Jan)








Figure 16-Work Zones (used for sweeping, leaf removal, and snow plowing)
