




Figure 1- Public Works Veterans




Figure 3- Operations Hours (July - November)



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- Cave Mill Road The Engineering staff has completed a review of the preliminary layout for the corridor and is currently identifying major impacts to property and existing
 - utilities. A public meeting, as well as meetings with individual property owners significantly impacted by the project, will be held in January 2024.
- **Traffic Calming** We are evaluating traffic in Forrest Park and Mt. Ayr neighborhoods, as well as continuing to monitor on Sandra Street. We are also researching alternative surface treatments to help improve safety on city streets.
- Nashville Road Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Draft- City Engineer, Melissa Cansler, attended a meeting on 27 November with the Bowling Green-Warren County Metropolitan Planning Organization to develop an MOU for access management of Nashville Road in the future. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) defines "Access Management" as the process of balancing the competing needs of traffic movement and land access. The area in consideration for the MOA is in the southwestern corridor of the city and county and outlined in Planning and Design Highlight #1.







Figure 13- Vehicles & Major Pieces of Equipment assigned by department




Figure 16- Public Works Zones (Used for Sweeping, Leaf Pick-up and Snow Plowing)
