


EYESORE TO ASSET

A brownfield is defined as a property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant. Challenges unique to brownfields redevelopment include environmental liability concerns, financial barriers, cleanup considerations, and reuse planning. Through federal grant funding, the EPA's Brownfields Program removes some of these barriers and serves as an empowerment tool for land and community revitalization.

To redevelop distressed properties and promote revitalization of underserved neighborhoods in Bowling Green through the identification and assessment of brownfield sites, and by collaborating with community stakeholders to design cleanup and redevelopment strategies.
