## MINUTES of REGULAR MEETING of the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS of the CITY of BOWLING GREEN, KENTUCKY held JANUARY 17, 2017

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on January 17, 2017. Mayor Bruce Wilkerson called the meeting to order. An invocation was given by Police Chaplain Mike Holian, and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Assistant City Manager/City Clerk Katie Schaller-Ward called the roll, and the following members were present: Commissioner Brian "Slim" Nash, Commissioner Sue Parrigin, Commissioner Rick Williams, Commissioner Joe W. Denning and Mayor Bruce Wilkerson. Absent: none. There was a full quorum of the Board of Commissioners.

#### **AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS**

Mayor Wilkerson proclaimed 2016 as "the Season of Bowling Green Purples Football" for their fifth Kentucky 5A Championship win in six years. He recognized Coach Kevin Wallace and several of the seniors on the football team. Mr. Wallace thanked the City for its continued support. Mayor Wilkerson also announced the United States Postal Service issued a public meeting notice regarding the potential relocation of the post office to be held January 31st at 6:00 p.m. at 601 State Street.

MUNICIPAL ORDER APPROVING PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES (PILOT) AGREEMENT RELATED TO THE NP BOWLING GREEN, LLC INDUSTRIAL PROJECT INVOLVING THE CITY OF BOWLING GREEN, COUNTY OF WARREN, BOARD OF EDUCATION OF WARREN COUNTY AND NP BOWLING GREEN, LLC, OR AN AFFILIATE THEREOF

Summary of Municipal Order No. 2017 - 14 was read by the Assistant City Manager/City Clerk. Motion was made by Parrigin and seconded by Nash for consideration of said Municipal Order. City Attorney Gene Harmon outlined the PILOT Agreement which was tied to the issuance of Industrial Revenue Bonds (IRB) related to a \$27-29 million economic development project in the Transpark creating 75 new jobs. He explained with the IRB, the property would be removed from the tax rolls and the Agreement established a prorated payment in lieu of taxes for the next 20 years. Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce Chief Operating Officer/Chief Financial Officer Meredith Robinson responded to questions about the project and type of jobs being created. Once the discussion ended, a roll call vote was taken.

### MUNICIPAL ORDER NO. 2017 - 15

MUNICIPAL ORDER APPROVING AMENDED AND RESTATED WORKFORCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BOWLING GREEN AND SOUTH CENTRAL KENTUCKY WORKS (SCKYWorks), INC.

Summary of Municipal Order No. 2017 - 15 was read by the Assistant City Manager/City Clerk. Motion was made by Parrigin and seconded by Williams for consideration of said Municipal Order. DeFebbo stated the community is in a period of transition regarding workforce and development. He indicated the City participated in a new program last year to help address the challenge of developing more skilled workers to meet the needs of new and expanding businesses. Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce COO/CFO Meredith Robinson remarked there are 13,000 job openings in the top six sectors that need to be filled and only about 4,500 unemployed workers which have been identified in the area. She explained these funds are being used to bring in outside experts to help expedite the process of setting up the workforce system which was supposed to have been put in place back in 1998 and never was. Chief Financial Officer Jeff Meisel explained the City had repurposed its Barren River Area Development District (BRADD) dues for this purpose.

Ms. Robinson and Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce Chief Executive Officer Ron Bunch responded to questions about the workforce system and its relationship with the Career Development Center as well as the ability to bring together several other agencies into a one-stop shop to augment and support Team Workforce. Mr. Bunch confirmed the number of open positions and number of unemployed represented the entire ten county area and that recruitment would have to come from other areas to fill the gap.

Commissioner Parrigin remarked being in an economic expansion was a good problem to have, but one that creates other challenges. Mayor Wilkerson commented it was important to set up the workforce system the right way from the beginning with the use of a consultant. Once the discussion ended, a roll call vote was taken.
