Mr. Childers indicated if this grant was awarded it would greatly assist with Phase I of the Parks Master Plan. Commissioners Nash and Williams

commended the local property owners and City for investing in such an opportunity. Meisel reported this would be a multi-year funded project to try and avoid issuing any debt on the project. Mayor Wilkerson asked for additional discussion, and with none, a roll call vote was taken.
