

**MINUTES of REGULAR MEETING
of the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS
of the CITY of BOWLING GREEN, KENTUCKY
held June 15, 2021**

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on June 15, 2021. Mayor Todd Alcott called the meeting to order. An invocation was given by Rev. Priscilla Vung Dim of Myanmar Assembly of God and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
