MUNICIPAL ORDER APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE BG CARES SMALL BUSINESS GRANT PROGRAM WITH SMALL BUSINESSES WHO QUALIFY FOR ECONOMIC RELIEF

Summary of Municipal Order No. 2021 – 22 was read by the City Clerk. Motion was made by Hill and seconded by Bailey for consideration of said Municipal Order. Meisel recommended approval of an amendment to the BG CARES Small Business Grant Program guidelines for small businesses who qualify for economic relief. He explained the amendments included an increase in allocation funding to \$15,000 for businesses with 26-50 full-time equivalents, \$7,500 for businesses with 6-25 full-time equivalents and \$2,500 for businesses with 1-5 full-time equivalents. It was further said any business that previously applied and received funding, would not need to reapply in order to take advantage of the increased funding. There was discussion about the small businesses qualifications and impacts, and once discussion concluded, it was unanimously agreed upon by the Board of Commissioners to amend the allocation funding to better assist smaller businesses. A motion was made by Bailey and seconded by Beasley-Brown to amend the allocations to \$3,000 for businesses with 1-5 full-time equivalents, \$7,000 for businesses with 6-25 full-time equivalents, and continue with the same distribution for the 26-50 full-time equivalents at \$15,000. Mayor Alcott asked for additional discussion, and with none, a roll call vote was taken.
