
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Bowling Green Board of Commissioners paid tribute to our public works professionals and issued a proclamation recognizing May 18th-24th, 2025, as National Public Works Week.

Summary: Operations completed 130 work orders in May. Operations repaired/installed 0 traffic signals and 90 signs. Zero injection wells were drilled. There were 1.96 miles of added maintenance from subdivision acceptance this year (6.53 miles for 2024). Operations crews also responded to downed trees in the city's Right-of-Way the weekend of 17 May.

Stormwater Management Regulation Review - The second of a series of meetings occurred to address stormwater regulations moving forward. Members from the CCPC, Warren County and Environmental Compliance will continue to work together to revise standards to help address the growing concerns the recent rainfall events have posed.

Freeport Road Widening - Work continues to widen and improve a city roadway that will provide much needed access to the northern portion of the Kentucky Trimodal Transpark. Storm infrastructure install is wrapping up and the install of the roundabout, curb and gutter began this month.

Accessible Pedestrian Signal (APS) training - Members from Operations, KYTC and Planning & Design met to learn more about the latest technology that allows audible information to be communicated to pedestrians with blindness or low vision signalized intersections.













Every year the city uses revenue from the liquid fuel tax and the General Fund to resurface roads. In Kentucky, the Liquid Fuel Tax was set in 2024 at 26.4¢ per gallon. The graphic above details the planned sections for resurfacing in 2025. On average, 11 miles of road are resurfaced, including new ADA ramps and striping. **Example A**: Dishman Ln (5 May), **Example B**: Fieldstone Blvd (7 May)



During the month of May, Fleet processed claims for hail damage on 45 city vehicles with a total damage estimate in excess of \$100,000.




