The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on September 17, 2019. Mayor Bruce Wilkerson called the meeting to order. An invocation was given by Commissioner Sue Parrigin and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. City Clerk Ashley Jackson called the roll, and the following members were present: Commissioner Joe W. Meisel indicated the Airport Board received a grant from the FAA for the construction of Taxiway A and explained the City and County's share was 2.5% each in the amount of \$211,463.22. Summary of Municipal Order No. 2019 - 164 was read by the City Clerk. Motion was made by Parrigin and seconded by Nash for consideration of said Municipal Order. Meisel explained Georgia-Pacific was expanding with the creation of fifty (50) new jobs over a three (3) year period and a capital investment of approximately \$110 million. He also said the County issued Industrial Revenue Bonds (IRB) for Georgia-Pacific and with the IRB, the property would be removed from the tax rolls and the Agreement establishes a prorated payment in lieu of taxes for the next 20 years on the expanded portion. Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce Chief Operating Officer Meredith Rozanski responded to questions about the project and type of jobs being created. Once the discussion ended, a roll call vote was taken.

ORDINANCE REZONING A TRACT OF LAND CONTAINING FROM RM-3 (TOWNHOUSE/MULTI-FAMILY ACRE RESIDENTIAL) TO GB (GENERAL BUSINESS) LOCATED AT 0

WHISPERING HILLS AND RUSSELLVILLE ROAD, PRESENTLY OWNED BY ELITE PROPERTIES, LLC C/O ALAA TLAIS

Title and summary of Ordinance No. BG2019 - 40 was read by the City Clerk. Motion was made by Parrigin and seconded by Wilkerson for first reading of said Ordinance. Mayor Wilkerson explained this was a recommendation of the City-County Planning Commission, and this rezoning was voted on twice, the first time included a tie vote and the second vote passed. He also reminded anyone wanting to speak about this rezoning would be allowed to do so, but it would be restricted to only those who commented at the hearing and the remarks should be a summary of the Planning The property owner Mr. Tlais explained he intends to have a drive-thru Commissions record. pharmacy, and he assured he took into consideration all the regulations, including safety and traffic. Whispering Hills Subdivision residents James Williams, Barry Rutledge and Wilson Wilkerham spoke in opposition of the rezoning due to traffic and safety, as well as the possibility of decreasing the value of nearby homes. There was clarification by Mr. Tlais there would be no speaker device in the drive thru window, it would only consist of a sliding window to alleviate any disturbance and protect the privacy of others, and he further said safety was a consideration in his application. There was further discussion about an 8 foot wooden fence with landscape that Mr. Tlais agreed to in the plan. Commissioner Beasley-Brown explained she was impressed by his entrepreneurship and excited for his future, however she was concerned about the location and protecting families in the neighborhood and based on the Comprehensive Plan principles she would be voting no. Commissioner Nash agreed with Commissioner Beasley-Brown's comments and said he does not think the site is compatible and he would also be voting no. Commissioner Parrigin expressed her appreciation to the neighborhood and Mr. Tlais, and explained she supports and has confidence in the City-County Planning Commissions decision. Once the discussion ended, a roll call vote was taken.

Title and summary of Ordinance No. BG2019 - 42 was read by the City Clerk. Motion was made by Nash and seconded by Denning for first reading of said Ordinance. Meisel recommended approval of the second non-exclusive telecommunications franchise, non-cable related, for use of rights-of-ways for the operations and maintenance of a system within the City. Mayor Wilkerson asked for additional discussion, and with none, a roll call vote was taken.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Following the regular agenda, Mayor Wilkerson opened the floor for any public comments about items not included on the agenda. Jennifer Morlan spoke in support of a City established mortgage assistance program. Teresa Christmas, Michael Gramling, David Coverdale, Cathy Severns and Francisco Sarano spoke about panhandling and homelessness, and Jay Wells spoke in support of a fairness ordinance. City Manager Meisel explained City staff and the local Homeless Coalition were working together to help with homelessness. He further said there was a difference between panhandling and homelessness and statistics show 20% or less of the homeless were not panhandling, however those that were panhandling go to homes and the panhandling signs were not intended for the homeless. Mayor Wilkerson clarified the City does not prohibit panhandling, but the panhandling signs suggest it is unsafe to be approached in vehicles or step into public rights-of-way.

CLOSED SESSION

Following a brief recess to clear the Commission Chamber, the Board of Commissioners met at approximately 6:20 p.m. in closed session pursuant to KRS 61.810 (1) (b) as previously approved.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Commissioners, at approximately 6:40 p.m., Mayor Wilkerson declared this meeting adjourned.
