City Manager Jeffery B. He also announced a GFOA 2018 *Award for Excellence in Government Finance for an Exceptionally Well Implemented Best Practice* was received for the City's biennial physical inventory process, and he recognized the staff who assisted with that review process.

CITY MANAGER
