

**MINUTES of REGULAR MEETING
of the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS
of the CITY of BOWLING GREEN, KENTUCKY
held September 6, 2022**

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on September 6, 2022. Mayor Todd Alcott called the meeting to order. The invocation was provided by Reverend Tammra Turner of State Street Baptist Church, and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. City Clerk Ashley Jackson called the roll, and the following members were present: Commissioner Carlos Bailey, Commissioner Dana Beasley-Brown, Commissioner Melinda Hill, Commissioner Sue Parrigin and Mayor Todd Alcott. Absent: none. There was a full quorum of the Board of Commissioners.

AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS

City Manager Jeffery B. Meisel congratulated the Bowling Green Police Department for receiving the 7th accreditation from the Kentucky Association of Chiefs of Police. Major Matt Edwards was recognized for his work and he reviewed the accreditation process.

CITY MANAGER

Meisel reminded the audience to sign-up in the back of the Commission Chamber in order to speak during public comments.

He also requested a closed session for discussions related to the selection of a successful bidder for award of a contract. Motion was made by Hill and seconded by Bailey to convene in closed session following the regular meeting pursuant to KRS 61.810 (1) (n). Mayor Alcott called for roll call vote.

PUBLIC HEARING

City Engineer Melissa Cansler conducted a public hearing for the purpose of reviewing the proposed Fiscal Year 2023 expenditure recommendations for the Municipal Aid Program (Liquid Fuel Tax) funds and Coal Mineral Severance Tax funds. She reported the current Liquid Fuel Tax (LFT) fund balance made up unencumbered funds from the previous fiscal year was \$1,030,000. The Fiscal Year 2023 LFT projected revenues were estimated at \$2,515,000 and projected expenditures were to total \$2,500,000. Ms. Cansler further explained the projects proposed include street resurfacing of approximately 16 miles of paving on City streets, as well as sidewalk, curb and gutter rehabilitation and other various transportation and intersection spot improvements. In addition it was reported the unencumbered Coal Mineral Severance Tax fund balance was \$139,000, which included carryover funds from the previous fiscal year. The projected revenues would be approximately \$35,000, while expenditures were \$0, with a projected ending balance of \$174,000. With no comments or questions from the public, the public hearing was closed.
