ORDINANCE RESCINDING INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE HISTORIC RAILROAD DEPOT

ORDINANCE RESCINDING INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BOWLING GREEN AND WARREN THE **HISTORIC** COUNTY RELATING TO LOCATED AT 401 RAILROAD DEPOT KENTUCKY STREET

WHEREAS, in Ordinance No. BG2001-7, the City of Bowling Green approved an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("Interlocal Agreement") with Warren County related to the renovation, promotion, development, financing, management and maintenance of the Historic Railroad Depot ("Depot") located at 401 Kentucky Street, which, at the time, was jointly owned by the City and Warren County; and,

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Agreement also created the City-County Depot Committee to oversee the renovation, promotion, development, financing, management and maintenance of the Depot; and,

WHEREAS, in Municipal Order No. 2020-13, the City of Bowling Green approved the conveyance of the property containing the Depot to the Warren County Downtown Economic Development Authority, Inc. ("Authority") so the Authority could manage the Depot and promote additional economic development on the property; and,

WHEREAS, the conveyance of the property containing the Depot to the Authority negates the need for the Interlocal Agreement and the City-County Depot Committee; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City and Warren County to rescind the Interlocal Agreement and to dissolve the City-County Depot Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky, as follows:

1. The Interlocal Cooperation Agreement Relating to the Historic Railroad Depot, dated February 2, 2001 is hereby rescinded, thereby, dissolving the City-County Depot Committee.

2. The Mayor, City Clerk and all other City staff and agents of the City are hereby authorized

and directed to take all necessary actions to carry out this Ordinance, including, but not limited to, any

notification to Warren County and the Department for Local Government of the rescission of this

Interlocal Agreement.

3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any section,

phrase or provision shall for any reason be declared invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not

affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance.

4. All prior Municipal Orders or Ordinances or parts of any Municipal Order or Ordinance in

conflict therewith are hereby repealed.

5. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to KRS 83A.060 in that it was introduced on

February 18, 2020, and given final reading on March 3, 2020, and said Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon signature, recordation and publication in summary pursuant to KRS Chapter 424.
