The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on April 15, 2025. The invocation was provided by the Children's Pastor Louis Tagliaboschi of Broadway United Methodist Church and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. ## PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mayor Alcott opened the floor for any public comments. David Williams, Garry Chaffin, Joel Mallett and Stephen Burnette residents of Stone Crest Avenue and Hearth Stone Circle commented on the recent flooding in the neighborhood and explained it was believed to be from the development in Sterling Business Park. It was also recommended there be more oversight on development projects to prevent future issues such as flooding. Also, Marshall Beach a resident on Cave Mill Road, spoke about

his house being flooded and suggested the City purchase the property for a retention basin. Juan Fuentes of Shannon Way discussed the flooding at his rental house and explained there was no assistance available through Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) due to the residence being a rental, and no flood insurance was available. City Manager Meisel recommended all residents affected by the flood to visit Buchanon Park to enroll in the FEMA process in order to qualify for assistance. The City would also be reviewing upcoming needs in various locations and subdivisions, as well as the stormwater division being heavily involved.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Commissioners, at approximately 6:00 p.m., Mayor Alcott declared this meeting adjourned.
