Admin Update



• American Public Works Association (APWA) Reaccreditation- The city's Public Works

Department is the only APWA Accredited Agency in the state of Kentucky and 1 of 194 agencies in North America. The department received its initial accreditation on 17 April 2007. Every 4-years the department is inspected for compliance with national standards across all five divisions. This year, the inspection examined 119 practices, accounting for 1/3 of the department's regulatory compliance. The team was assessed as being in full compliance 117 on items, substantial compliance for 1 item and 1 listed as not applicable. The department is fully accredited for another 4years! (8-9 Aug)

Operations Update

- Summary- Operations completed <u>103 work orders</u> in August (79 for July). Asphalt paving, pothole repairs, tree trimming, curb/drainage repairs, sidewalk repairs, and weed and alley maintenance (including mowing and bush hogging) continued to account for the majority of work.
- **Curb Painting Summary** Curb painting occurs every 3-years in the city. Due to budgetary restrictions, curb painting slated for FY23 was consolidated into FY24 and completed this summer. For FY23/24 we used 980 gallons of yellow paint at a cost of \$18,718.



- 2023 Fall Leaf Pickup Scheduled- Beginning on 30 October.
- *Hi Visibility Street Closure Support* 8-10 September for Holley LS Fest. Expected crowd of 40K.





Figure 4- Operations Hours (May-August)


- FY24 Overlay evaluation Staff is approximately 50% complete on field inspections determining overlay needs for the current fiscal year contract.
- College Street Pedestrian Bridge Final structural inspection completed this month on underside components of the bridge and the engineer is preparing repair recommendations. Construction continues on pier repairs and the bridge has been closed to pedestrians to prep for lead removal and repainting. It will reopen in November.
- **31-W Bypass** Continue work with KYTC on the operation of the Broadway Ave. signalized intersection. Monitoring level of service to determine if minor modifications are needed on city-maintained portion to allow two thru lanes out of town.
- Planning efforts for upcoming Highway Plan- Staff worked alongside other local agencies and the MPO Technical Advisory Committee to identify priority projects to "sponsor" for the next Highway Plan that will be recommended by Governor Beshear.
- Ashley Circle/Westen St. Roundabout Construction continues and work began on the "inner island" this month. Through traffic has been maintained throughout construction with a few exceptions.




- Jennings Creek Contamination Event, On Tuesday August 15, 2023 ECD staff received a
 report Jennings Creek was experiencing a bloom of iron processing bacteria resulting in a
 foul smelling scum in the stream and dead wildlife. The resulting investigation revealed
 County Oven Bakery (COB) was actively releasing hundreds of thousands of gallons of
 wastewater into a sinkhole. The contaminated water was reemerging at Wells Spring, the
 headwaters of Jennings Creek. ECD staff immediately began working with COB to capture
 the water and eliminate the discharge. The work continues.
- Jennings Creek Parks, ECD staff continue to facilitate the collection of funds from nonprofits and state grants for the construction of parks along the Creekwood Greenway. MKSK Landscape Architects has been selected to design the playground and complete the greenway masterplan.

What is a Class V well?

A Class V well is used to inject non-hazardous fluids underground. Fluids are injected either into or above an underground source of drinking water.

Class V wells include any wells that are not already classified as Classes I-IV or Class VI wells. This diverse group ranges from simple shallow wells to complex experimental injection technologies.

Most Class V wells are "low-tech" and depend on gravity to drain fluids directly below the land surface. Dry wells, cesspools, and septic system leach fields are examples of simple Class V wells. Because their construction often provides little or no pretreatment and these fluids are injected directly into or above an underground source of drinking water, proper management is important.




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- *City Hall Annex- Licensing Renovation-* This work allowed us to create two new offices in the City Hall Annex. Work is substantially complete.









Figure 13- A busy day for fleet (18 Aug)
