## MINUTES of REGULAR MEETING of the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS of the CITY of BOWLING GREEN, KENTUCKY held JUNE 19, 2018

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on June 19, 2018. Mayor Bruce Wilkerson called the meeting to order. An invocation was given by Commissioner Sue Parrigin, and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Assistant City Manager/City Clerk Katie Schaller-Ward called the roll, and the following members were present: Commissioner Joe W. Denning, Commissioner Brian "Slim" Nash, Commissioner Sue Parrigin, Commissioner Rick Williams and Mayor Bruce Wilkerson. Absent: none. There was a full quorum of the Board of Commissioners.

#### **AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS**

Executive Assistant/Public Information Officer Kim Lancaster presented certificates and gift prizes to the winners of the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual "We are Bowling Green" photo contest: 1<sup>st</sup> place - Beautiful Bridge by Tanner Kremer; 2<sup>nd</sup> place - Downtown Reflection Inside Out by Sheila Reeves; 3<sup>rd</sup> place -Snowy Night at the Square by Fred Dent; and the people's choice - Beautiful Bridge by Tanner Kremer. Ms. Lancaster stated there were 90 qualified entries in this year's event and many of the photographs will be used to populate the 2018/2019 Annual Report Calendar.

Mayor Wilkerson announced the City received a 2017-2018 Mid-South Conference Corporate Partner Award for outstanding support of the student-athletes, coaches and administrators as many of the alethic events were held in Bowling Green. He also stated that Mid-South Conference would be making an announcement at a press conference on June 20th regarding future years for athletic events to be held in Bowling Green.
