Language Access Services

Language Access Services ensures that limited English proficient (LEP) constituents have equal access, including telephone interpretation, in-person interpretation, vital documents translation, and training of City employees.

The City of Bowling Green provides language access to people who do not speak, read, write, or understand English. You can get free interpreter services when you need assistance or information from a City Department.



New Neighbor Series

The New Neighbor Series is an educational session for City Staff and Community to learn about the history, cultural traditions, foods, dances and more from specific cultural groups represented in the city of Bowling Green. The New Neighbor Series is held once per year.
